1.0 INTRODUCTION

The

- i. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Two Million, Eight Hundred and Ten Thousand and Ninety-Two United States Dollars (US\$2,810,092.00) on materials and equipment to be procured for the construction of additional facilities, supply and installation of medical equipment to the adjunct Clinical Block at the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital in the Upper East Region;
- ii. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Fifteen Million, Eight Hundred and Nine Thousand, Five Hundred and Sixty-Eight Euros (€15,809,568.00) on materials and equipment to be imported in respect of the Modernization of the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital (KATH) maternity and Children's Blocks by Messrs. Contracta Construction UK Limited:
- iii. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Twelve Million, Nine Hundred and Twenty-Nine Thousand, Three Hundred and twenty-Nine Euros and Forty-Eight Cents (€12,929,329.48 [made up of €741,890.08 on local purchases and €12,187,439.40 on imports]) on materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the construction and equipping of Twelve (12) Polyclinics in Ashanti, Eastern, Greater Accra and Ahafo Regions in Ghana by Messrs. VAMED Health Projects CZ s.r.o (affiliate of VAMED Engineering); and
- iv. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy and Domestic VAT amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Six Million, Eight Hundred and Fourteen Thousand, Eight Hundred and Nineteen Euros (€6,814,819.00 [made up of €206,104.00 on local purchases and €6,608,716.00 on imports]) on materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the execution of the Turnkey construction of a Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital by Messrs. VAMED Engineering Gmbh of Austria

were laid in the House on Monday, 27th July, 2020 by a Deputy Minister for Finance, Hon. Kwaku Agyeman Kwarteng on behalf the Minister responsible for Finance.

Rt. Hon. Speaker referred the above agreements to the Finance Committee for consideration and report.

The Committee met with, a Deputy Minister for Finance, Hon Mrs. Abena Osei-Asare, a Deputy Minister for Health, Hon. Bernard Okoe Boye and officers from the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Health and the Ghana Revenue Authority (GRA) to consider the referrals.

2.0 DOCUMENTS REFERRED TO

The Committee referred to the following documents:

- 1. The 1992 Constitution;
- 2. The Public Financial Management Act, 2016 (Act 921);
- 3. The Commercial Contract of €38,000,000.00 between the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Ghana and Vamed Engineering GmbH, Austria for the Turnkey Construction of a Urology and Nephrology Centre of excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital;
- 4. The Commercial Contract of €71,500,000 between the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Ghana and Vamed Engineering GmbH for the construction of 12 polyclinics in Ashanti, Eastern, Greater Accra and Ahafo regions in Ghana;
- 5. The Additional Loan Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Ghana and the Saudi Fund for Development for an amount of Seventy-Five Million Saudi Riyals (SR75,000,000) equivalent to US\$20.0 Million to finance the construction of additional facilities and installation at the Adjunct Clinical Block at the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital;
- 6. The Contract Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Ghana represented by the Ministry of Health and Contracta Construction UK Limited for an amount of €138,500,000.00 for the completion and equipping of the Maternity and Children's Blocks at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital; and
- 7. The Standing Orders of the Parliament of Ghana;

3.0 BACKGROUND

3.1 Rehabilitation of Bolgatanga Regional Hospital

The Upper East Region has been identified as one of the deprived areas of the country. There is evidence that physical access to healthcare is a great challenge to residents in the region.

In order to address the challenges, promote effective clinical service delivery and to meet people's expectations, Government commenced a major rehabilitation works at the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital. The works were divided into three (3) phases.

Phase One (1) is complete and it covered the construction of Adjunct Clinical Block, Out-Patient's Department (OPD), Wards, Surgical Departments, Laboratory, Pharmacy, X-Ray and Accident and Emergency.

Phase Two (2) would cover the installation of medical equipment and furniture to make the completed Clinical Block functional. Phase Three (3) would further cover facilities that would be required to make the Regional Hospital fully functional.

In order to execute Phase Two (2), Government has sourced a loan amounting to SR\$75,000,000 (equivalent to US\$20.0 Million). This loan Agreement was approved by Parliament at its Twentieth Sitting of its First Meeting held on Friday, 1st March, 2019.

Schedule No.1 item (B) (ii) of the Loan Agreement provides that no withdrawal is to be made from the loan proceeds to finance 'taxes levied by, or in the territory of the Borrower on goods or services, or on the importation, manufacture, procurement or supply thereof'. This provision therefore puts the responsibility for the payment of taxes and duties on goods and services to be procured under the project on Government.

In order to implement the project successfully, there is the need to waive taxes and duties applicable. It is in this regard that the request for the waiver of taxes and duties for the construction of additional facilities, supply and installation of medical equipment to the adjunct Clinical Block at the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital in the Upper East Region has been submitted to Parliament in accordance with Article 174 of the 1992 Constitution of Ghana.

3.2 Modernization of the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital (KATH) Maternity and Children's Blocks

Maternal and Child healthcare has been identified as one of the critical health needs in the country.

Recognizing the importance of maternal and child healthcare, the then Supreme Military Council sought to expand the Komfo Anokye teaching Hospital in Kumasi to include maternity services which resulted in the conception of an Eight (8) storey, 1,000 bed Maternity and Children's Block in 1974.

The Contract for the project was awarded in 1976 by the Central Tender Board, Accra leading to the construction of the pediatrics section. The project was however suspended and eventually abandoned in 1979 when 70% of the structure had approximately been constructed.

In 1999, the project was reactivated and all the structural framework including the foundation in the sub-structure was demolished and reconstructed. The project was also included in the Public Investment Programme of the Ministry of Health but the amount voted to complete it over the years has never been sufficient.

Committed to the provision of health infrastructure, Government has now sourced two loan facilities from Deutsche Bank AG, London Branch for an amount of €122,543,352.60 and €32,500,000.00 to finance the completion and equipping of the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital Maternity and Children's Block respectively. At its Forty-Sixth Meeting on Friday, 12th April, 2019, Parliament approved the two loan agreements.

Pursuant to the above, the Ministry of Health has contacted Messrs. Contracta Construction UK to complete the project.

Clause 7 of the Commercial Agreement makes it incumbent for Government to bear responsibility for the payment of all applicable taxes, duties and levies that may be assessed on the core materials and equipment to be procured for the implementation of the project.

In order to implement the project successfully, there is the need to waive taxes and duties applicable. It is in this regard that the request for the waiver of taxes and duties materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the execution of the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital (KATH) Maternity and Children's Blocks has been submitted to Parliament in accordance with Article 174 of the 1992 Constitution of Ghana.

3.3 Construction and Equipping of 12 Polyclinics in the Ashanti, Eastern, Greater Accra and Ahafo Regions

The Government of Ghana is committed to ensuring the provision of health infrastructure to enhance the quality of health services delivery, and also promote universal access to healthcare in the country. The policy thrust of the Ministry of

Health (MoH) is to reduce inequities in access to care and increase coverage, quality and use of health services so as to achieve a healthier national population.

In furtherance of this, the Ministry of Health undertook an assessment of the health care infrastructure in the country and has identified gaps inhibiting access to healthcare.

In order to address the gaps identified and to meet the government's commitment to universal health care coverage as required by the SDG 3, the Ministry of Health intends to undertake a number of projects across the country and is exploring various financing schemes to finance these projects. One of such projects is the construction of 12 Polyclinics in Ashanti, Eastern, Greater Accra and Ahafo regions.

In order to undertake this project, Government, through the Ministries of Finance and Health has sourced a loan facility of €79,265,656 from Erste Group Bank AG, Česká Spořitelna, a.s. (as Arrangers and Original Lenders).

The Ministry of Health has accordingly engaged VAMED Health Projects CZ, s.r.o, Czech Republic for the construction and equipping of the Twelve (12) polyclinics in Ashanti, Eastern, Ahafo and Greater Accra Regions.

Under the contract, VAMED Health Projects CZ is to construct, retool, and supply equipment to the selected hospitals. Clause GCC 1.13b (a) of the Particular Conditions of Contract (compliance with the laws) provides that the project is exempted from the payment of taxes and duties applicable. This then puts the liability for the payment of taxes on the Government of Ghana.

In order to implement the project successfully, there is the need to waive taxes and duties applicable. It is in this regard that the request for the waiver of taxes and duties for the construction and equipping the Twelve (12) polyclinics in Ashanti, Eastern, Ahafo and Greater Accra Regions has been submitted to Parliament in accordance with Article 174 of the 1992 Constitution of Ghana.

3.4 Construction of Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital

Ghana's health development strategies since independence have focused on healthcare delivery. Government strategies have been to address the challenges relating to access to healthcare and contain the spread of communicable diseases.

As the population ages, conditions that disproportionately affect the aged are becoming increasing prevalent. These include musculoskeletal and neuro-degenerative disorders. Prevalence of prostate cancer in people older than 50 years is around 7%, which affects more than 80,000 people. In addition, 260,000 cases of diabetes have been recorded while 4 million is estimated to exist.

Korle-Bu Teaching Hospital is the main referral point for Urology and Nephrology in the country.

It has however been observed that there is a deficiency in public and private Health Care delivery in Urology and Nephrology in the country and this needs to be addressed.

In order to address this deficiency and provide the needed healthcare for people especially the aged, Government has sourced a €38.0 Million Credit Facility from the Raiffeisen Bank International AG Ltd to construct a modern state-of-the-art Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital. This Loan Agreement was approved by Parliament at its Forty-First Sitting held on 31st March, 2020.

Clause GCC 1.13b (a) of the Particular Conditions of contract (compliance with the laws), states that the "Ministry of Health to assist in the acquisition of the necessary tax exemptions for the project". This provision therefore puts the responsibility for the payment of taxes and duties on goods and services to be procured under the project of Government.

In order to implement the project successfully, there is the need to waive taxes and duties applicable. It is in this regard that the request for the waiver of taxes and duties, materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the execution of the Turnkey construction of the Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital has been submitted to Parliament in accordance with Article 174 of the 1992 Constitution of Ghana.

4.0 THE REQUESTS

The requests are to seek approval for the waiver of taxes and duties amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of:

- US\$2,810,092.00 on materials and equipment to be procured for the construction of additional facilities and supply and installation of medical equipment to the adjunct Clinical Block at the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital in the Upper East Region;
- ii. €15,809,568.00 on materials and equipment to be imported for the completion and equipping the Maternity and Children's Block at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital in the Ashanti Region;
- iii. €12,929,329.48 on materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the Construction and Equipping of Twelve (12) Polyclinics in the Ashanti, Eastern, Greater Accra and Ahafo Regions in Ghana by Messrs. VAMED Health Projects CZ s.r.o (affiliated of VAMED Engineering); and
- iv. €6,814,819.00 on materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the execution of the Turnkey Construction of the Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital by Messrs. VAMED Engineering Gmbh.

Attached as an APPENDIX are the details of the various tax assessments.

5.0 OBSERVATIONS

5.1 Rationale for Requesting for Waiver for the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital Construction Project

The Committee was informed that the Upper East Region is one of the deprived regions with respect to provision of healthcare. It is to address this gap that Government constructed the Adjunct Clinical Block at the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital.

The main objectives of the project include:

enabling the hospital attain full operational status as a regional hospital and provide the enabling environment for attracting the needed healthcare professionals to work in the Hospital;

- providing the necessary infrastructure and ultra-modern medical equipment and ancillary services to increase capacity of the hospital to its fullest;
- Improving provision of quality healthcare to the general public; and
- creating opportunity for operational excellence and knowledge sharing in the area of healthcare

The request is to ensure the smooth implementation and timely completion of the project. It is in this light that the request for waiver for the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital Project has been submitted to the House for approval.

5.2 Rationale for Requesting for Waiver for the Maternity and Children's Block Construction Project at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital

The Committee observed that the Maternity and Children's Block Project commenced in 1974 and it was aimed at improving the healthcare of patients especially mothers and children as well as positioning the KATH to adequately manage the increase in the volume of patient care and make KATH one of the Centres of Excellence. Unfortunately the project has stalled due to inadequate funding.

It was in this light that Government sourced the two loan facilities amounting to €122,543,352.60 from Deutsche Bank AG, London UK to complete the project.

Per the EPC/ Turnkey Contract Agreement with the Contractor (Contracta Construction UK), the project is to be waived from the payment of taxes and duties.

5.3 Rationale for Requesting for Waiver for the Twelve (12) Polyclinics construction Project

The Committee was informed that the vision of Government is to have a healthy population for national development. In line with this vision and ensure equitable and adequate distribution of health infrastructure, Government is constructing and equipping health facilities across the country.

One of such projects is the construction of Twelve (12) polyclinics in Ashanti, Eastern, Ahafo and Greater Accra Regions. Details of the location of the Twelve (12) polyclinics to be constructed are provided in Table 1 below:

5.4 Rationale for Requesting for Waiver for the Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence construction Project

The Committee was informed that Government is constructing a modern state-of-the-art Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital. The facility is to take care of diseases such as musculoskeletal and degenerative disorders, prostate cancer, diabetes and other diseases that usually affect the aged.

As part of the terms and conditions of the Contract Agreement, the project is exempted from the payment of taxes and duties.

5.5 Benefits of the Projects

The Committee observed that benefits to be derived from the projects include:

- narrowing the geographical access gap in healthcare delivery;
- providing services to the under-served and unserved communities for the purposes of primary referrals whilst taking advantage of medical tourism from neighbouring countries;

- providing the opportunity to adopt Information and Communication
 Technology in the delivery of quality healthcare and also support the broad e Health and e-Learning agenda under the National e-Health Strategy; and
- ensuring that healthcare requirements of towns within the catchment areas of the hospital projects are conveniently catered for.

6.0 CONCLUSION

Considering the immense benefits to be derived from the projects, the Committee is of the view that the requests will go a long way to help realize Government's objective of providing quality healthcare for the citizenry.

The Committee therefore recommends to the House to adopt its report and approve the:

- i. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Two Million, Eight Hundred and Ten Thousand and Ninety-Two United States Dollars (US\$2,810,092.00) on materials and equipment to be procured for the construction of additional facilities, supply and installation of medical equipment to the adjunct Clinical Block at the Bolgatanga Regional Hospital in the Upper East Region;
- ii. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Fifteen Million, Eight Hundred and Nine Thousand, Five Hundred and Sixty-Eight Euros (€15,809,568.00) on materials and equipment to be imported in respect of the Modernization of the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital (KATH) maternity and Children's Blocks by Messrs. Contracta Construction UK Limited;
- iii. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Twelve Million, Nine Hundred and Twenty-Nine Thousand, Three Hundred and Twenty-Nine Euros and Forty-Eight Cents (€12,929,329.48 [made up of €741,890.08 on local purchases and €12,187,439.40 on imports]) on materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the construction and equipping of Twelve (12) Polyclinics in Ashanti, Eastern, Greater Accra and Ahafo Regions in Ghana by Messrs. VAMED Health Projects CZ s.r.o (affiliate of VAMED Engineering) and

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iv. request for waiver of Import Duties, Import VAT, NHIL, GETFund Levy, EXIM Levy and Special Import Levy and Domestic VAT amounting to the Ghana Cedi equivalent of Six Million, Eight Hundred and Fourteen Thousand, Eight Hundred and Nineteen Euros (€6,814,819.00 [made up of €206,104.00 on local purchases and €6,608,716.00 on imports]) on materials, equipment, works and services to be procured for the execution of the Turnkey construction of a Urology and Nephrology Centre of Excellence at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital by Messrs.
