REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND COMMUNICATIONS ON THE CREDIT FACILITY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF GHANA AND MESSRS. DAF BUS INTERNATIONAL b.v. OF THE NETHERLANDS IN THE AMOUNT OF NLG 18,286,287 (US\$7,224,069.00) FOR THE IMPORTATION OF 100 DAF/NEOPLAN BUSES

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The above Agreement was laid in the House on Wednesday, 18^{th} July 2001, in accordance with Article 181 of the Constitution, and referred to the Joint Committee on Finance and Communications for consideration and report, pursuant to Standing Order 171(1). The Committee met with the Minister for Transport and Communication, Hon Felix Owusu-Adjapong, and his technical men and reports as follows:

2.0 BACKGROUND

Members will recall that H.E. the President in his Sessional Address to this House early this year indicated his Government's intention to introduce Mass Transportation into the country. As part of the policy, the Ministry of Transport and Communications has sourced some concessionary loans to fund the importation of

buses for the private sector to bring this vision to reality.

This first batch of 100 buses is to be funded with a Dutch concessionary Credit facility of NLG 28,132,750 (US\$11,113,953) consisting of a Mixed Credit facility of 35% ORET Grant and 65% concessionary loan.

The DAF Bus International b.v. of the Netherlands, represented by Mechanical Lloyd in Ghana, will manufacture the chassis and body kits of the buses and ship them to Ghana for Neoplan (Gh) Ltd. to construct.

3.0 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. ORET GRANT

Total Credit Amount

NLG 9,846,463 (US\$3,889,883.80) (ie. 35% of the Principal Loan including cost financing of about NLG 927,000)

Conditions for disbursement

- The Grant Agreement must be signed by both parties
- The Concesionary Loan should become effective
- The DAF Bus International b. v. must provide a Bank Guarantee covering its component of the advance down payment

- The GPRTU must guarantee an increase of its tariff by at least 10% and this should be unrelated to any increase due to other factors, particularly fuel.
- Government must approve the increase in tariff mentioned above

B. COMMERCIAL LOAN

Total Loan Amount - NLG 18,286,287

(US\$7,224,069.6)

(65% of the Principal Loan)

Interest - 7.15% of outstanding balance

Repayment Period - 7 years(14 semi-annual

Instalments)

Grace Period - 1year

4.0 OBSERVATIONS

The Committee observed that though the original Agreement dated 22nd May 2001 had the GPRTU as Borrower and ING Bank N.V as the Lender, this has been substituted with a later Agreement dated 20th July 2001 which has the Republic of Ghana as the Borrower and the ING Bank N.V. as the Lender. In the earlier Agreement the GPRTU was the sole beneficiary but this new Agreement includes other transport organizations like the Progressive Transport Associations (PROTOA) and the Cooperative Transport Association. (Please find attached a letter from the GPRTU acknowledging the Ministry's intention to

distribute the buses among all the named beneficiaries)

The Committee was thus of the view that as this credit would be onlent to the GPRTU, PROTOA and Co-operatives by the Government of Ghana, these beneficiaries should be made to produce evidence of their ability to repay, possibly in the form of Bank guarantees, before the facility is extended to them so as to protect the Government from an undue financial burden.

The Committee was informed that to ensure the beneficiaries' ability to pay back the loan, discussions with them are ongoing so that they would give to the Ministry a level of initial guarantee that they will be able to support the Government's efforts. They are also to propose appropriate modalities they intend putting in place for repayment without putting undue financial constraints on the Government. In this light an escrow account is to be set up into which payments for the loan would be made on schedule. The signatories to the account will include a representation from the Ministry of Finance, Controller and Accountant-General and the beneficiaries.

Members also held fears with regards to the supply of spare parts. They were of the view that whatever spare parts are to be provided should be stated in black and white. This is because leaving the issue vague may lead to the importation of one part and not the other or even poor quality parts, which would end up being more of a liability than a help to the Government, which is the borrower. In this light Members asked that the make of the vehicles be specified so that the wrong parts would not be brought in for them.

5.0 RECOMMENDATION

The Committee, having closely examined the Mixed Credit facility Agreement of NLG 18,286,287 (US\$7,224,069.6) between the Government and Messrs. DAF Bus International b.v. of the Netherlands, recommends to the House its approval, by Resolution, in accordance with Article 181 of the Constitution and Section 7 of the Loans Act 1970, Act 335.
