

**REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION
ON THE ROAD TRAFFIC (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2001
L.I. 1687**

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulation 2001 L.I. 1687 was laid before the House and referred to the Committee on Subsidiary Legislation on Tuesday, 3rd July 2001, pursuant to Article 11(7) of the Constitution and Standing Order 166.

2.0 REFERENCES

In considering the Bill, the Committee examined the following documents and enactments:

- (i) The Constitution of the Republic of Ghana
- (ii) Standing Orders of Parliament
- (iii) The Driver and Vehicle Licensing Authority Act 1999, Act 569; and
- (iv) The Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulations 1998.

3.0 BACKGROUND

The authority of the Minister for Transport and Communications to make this Regulations derives from section 26: Subsection (1) & (2)(d) of the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Authority Act 1999, Act 569 which provides as follows:

- (1) "The Minister may on the recommendation of the Board, by Legislative Instrument, make regulations relating to driving and use of motor vehicles and for giving effect to this Act".
- (2) Regulations under subsection (1) of this section may provide for -
 - (d) "fees to be charged for services performed by the Authority".

4.0 **DELIBERATION**


The Committee was assisted by the Chief Executive of the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Authority and his technical team.


5.0 **OBSERVATION**

The L.I. 1687 is seeking the approval of Parliament for upward revision of fees charged by the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Authority for services rendered by them.

6.0 **RECOMMENDATION/CONCLUSION**

The Committee considers the L.I. 1687 consistent with the provisions of the parent Act and the Standing Orders of Parliament and accordingly recommends its passage into law by the House with the effluxion of time.


