1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Financing Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Ghana and the International Development Association (IDA) for an amount equivalent to Twenty-Eight Million, Nine Hundred Thousand Special Drawing Rights (SDR 28,900,000) [US\$40.0 million equivalent] as additional financing for the Ghana Secondary School Education Improvement Project was laid in the House on 10th November, 2017.

Pursuant to article 103 of the 1992 Constitution and Orders 169 and 171 of the Standing Orders of the House, the agreement was referred to the Committee on Finance for consideration and report.

The Committee subsequently met and discussed the Agreement with the Leadership of the Committee on Education, the Minister for Education, Hon. Matthew Opoku Prempeh, Deputy Minister for Education, Dr. Yaw Osei Adutwum, Deputy Minister for Finance, Hon. Abena Osei-Asare as well as officials from the Ministries of Finance and Education. The Committee hereby submits this report to the House pursuant to the Standing Orders of the House.

The Committee is grateful to the Honourable Minister for Education, Deputy Minister for Finance and the officials from the Ministries of Finance and Education for attending upon the Committee.

2.0 REFERENCES

The Committee referred to and was guided by the following documents *inter alia* during its deliberations on the Agreement:

- The 1992 Constitution of the Republic of Ghana
- The Standing Orders of the Parliament of Ghana

- The Public Financial Management Act, 2016 (Act 921)
- The Budget Statement and Economic Policy of the Government of Ghana for the 2017 Financial Year.

3.0 **BACKGROUND**

Access to primary education in Ghana is currently nearing universal levels following the implementation of the Free Compulsory Universal Basic Education (FCUBE) programme over the last two decades. The increased numbers resulted in high demand for secondary education. The expansion of senior high school infrastructure has however not kept pace with the increased demand. The supply gap has created inequities where about one-third of those taking the Basic Education Certificate Examination (BECE) do not gain admission into SHS with those coming from the deprived districts being about six times less likely to access SHS.

As efforts have been made over the years to increase access to Senior High education, there has arisen also the need to put deliberate interventions in place for quality improvement to ensure that standards are not compromised.

WASSCE results show that learning outcomes have been declining since 2012. The results also demonstrate significant regional disparities in terms of performance. Since high-quality SHSs will likely remain selective, increases in access will mostly be in lower-quality SHSs thus deepening the existing disparities between high performing schools and the rest of the schools.

The Secondary Education Improvement Project (SEIP) was therefore designed in 2014 to increase access to Senior High School education in under-served districts and to improve quality in low performing Senior

High Schools. The present additional financing will provide support to over One Hundred Senior High Schools in anticipation of an increased demand following the Government's Free SHS Initiative.

3.1 PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Project are

- i. To increase access to Senior High education in under-served districts; and
- ii. To improve quality in low-performing Senior High Schools in Ghana.

4.0 TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE LOAN

The terms and conditions of the Loan are as follows:

Loan Amount	- SDR 28.9 million (equivalent to US\$40 million)
Grace Period	- 5 years
Re-payment Period	- 20 years (exclusive of grace period)
Maturity Period	- 25 years
Maximum Commitment Charge	- 0.5% per annum

Interest rate	- 1.25% per annum

5.0 **OBSERVATIONS**

5.1 **Waiver of Commitment Charge**

The Committee was informed by officials from the Ministry of Finance that the Maximum Commitment Charge of 0.5% has been waived for the first year of the Additional Financing (AF) and that the Board of the IDA is empowered to review the waiver year-on-year with a view to continuing the waiver or otherwise. It was further explained to the Committee that in line with previous dealings with the IDA, it was unlikely that the waiver would be curtailed in subsequent years as the IDA Board was said to have never done so previously.

5.2 **Original Project Components, Cost and Description**

The original phase of the Project had two components:

Component 1 – Increase Access with equity and Quality in Senior High Schools (US\$140.1 million): This Component uses results-based financing (RBF) approach that links disbursement of funds to delivery and verification of agreed results. The first group of results area focuses on expanding senior high school places through the construction of approximately 23 new SHS in under-served districts; rehabilitating and expanding existing facilities of low performing SHS and supporting attainment of disadvantaged students (e.g. through scholarships to students from low income families, especially girls).

The second group of results area under Component 1 focuses on improving the quality of education in selected low-performing SHSs through:

- a. Strengthened school management and accountability;
- b. Improved mathematics and science teaching and learning; and
- c. Expanded ICT and internet connectivity in schools

Component 2 – Management, Research and Monitoring and Evaluation (US\$15.9 million): This component supports technical assistance, management, research, and monitoring and evaluation for effective project implementation and uses traditional investment approach.

5.3 Performance of the Original Project

The Committee was informed that an assessment of the Project by the World Bank showed that the Project has performed satisfactorily in the last two and half years as disbursement stood at over 80 percent. (i.e. US\$126.168 million out of US\$156 million disbursed as at 17th November, 2017.).

Achievements of the Project include:

- a. 86% construction works completed (25 contracts completed; 19 on-going; 2 terminated)
- b. 46 facilities upgrade contracts have been completed
- c. 10,027 (cumulative) SHS students receiving scholarships in beneficiary schools;
- d. School Performance Partnership Plans (SPPPs) signed by all 125 beneficiary schools. Funding provided for implementation of the non-procurement activities;
- e. 1,000 Science and Maths teachers trained in modern methods of delivery; plans for cluster training of teachers drawn up
- f. Research Consultant and Research Institution recruited to implement research agenda
- g. ICT-based instruction for SHS 1 and 2 core-subjects rolled out in 70 targeted schools. Preparation of ICT instruction for SHS core-subjects is in progress.

- h. All SHSs (Public and Private) have been mapped and website portal established to make information on SHSs available online (www.ghanaschoolsinfo.org) for all stakeholders. A school mapping digest for the financial year 2016 has been printed and distributed to all JHSs to enable pupils make informed SHS choices
- i. Procurement of classroom furniture for 13 No. E-Blocks; office equipment for 23 SHSs, laboratory furniture and hardware for 13 SHSs, Laboratory equipment and chemicals for 13 SHSs, office furniture and cabinets and safes for 23 SHSs, i-box accessories for 80 SHSs, 150 solar panels for i-boxes, i-box accessories, printing of leadership training manuals, Safeguards Specialist, Safeguards Auditor and Consultant for Environmental screening and panel van for servicing i-boxes are all in progress.

Outstanding procurement activities under the original project include the construction of 2 No. Technical Blocks and 3 No. Vocational Blocks as well as the Procurement of 7 Servers for school mapping.

5.4 Scope of the Additional Financing

The Committee noted that under the Additional Financing (AF), 75 Senior High Schools (SHSs) would have their facilities upgraded to improve academic performance. Also, there would be quality improvement support to 107 additional schools.

5.5 Expected Benefits of the Project

The project is expected to help in the achievement of better grades in the West African Senior School Certificate Examination (WASSCE) of 6 credits and above in the beneficiary schools thereby increasing the transition rates from SHS to the tertiary level. The project is also

expected to, among other things, increase the enrolment in beneficiary SHSs for students from low-income families especially girls.

5.6 Free SHS vrs. Bursary

Members wanted to know whether the Bursary component of the Project was necessary given the implementation of the Free Senior High School policy by Government. On this, the Minister for Education, Hon. Matthew Opoku Prempeh explained that whilst the Free SHS policy takes care of all the fees payable by students, the bursary component under the Project is aimed at assisting the beneficiary students to meet other expenses such as transportation, clothing, footwear and other necessary living expenses.

5.7 Institutional and Implementation Arrangements

The Committee was informed that the existing Project Steering Committee (PSC) shall continue to hold oversight responsibility over the project. The PSC is chaired by the Minister for Education with a Deputy Minister as Vice Chair. Members of the PSC comprise the Chief Director of the Ministry of Education, the Director General of the Ghana Education Service (GES), the Financial Controller, the Project Coordinator, Head of the Project Civil Works Team, Head of the Quality and Outcomes Team, and representatives of the Ministry of Finance, GETFund, the Council of Heads of Assisted Secondary Schools (CHASS), as well as regional and district representatives. In all, oversight responsibility rests with the Ministry of Education whilst the GES provides its mandated implementation role for service delivery.

5.8 Strategic Fit of the Project

The AF will support Ghana's Education Strategic Plan (ESP 2016-2030) to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong

learning opportunities for all, in line with the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

The project also dovetails into Ghana's lower-middle income status which requires more secondary level graduates with the relevant skills to enter the labour market, hence investing in secondary education will improve the human capital of the country thus boosting growth. Quality education would also enhance the earnings of individuals whilst the state gains socio-economically from an educated populace, in terms of larger tax revenues and savings in government expenditure on health and crimes.

6.0 CONCLUSION


